Residents of New Road are finding it very difficult to get in and out of the road due to people leaving their vehicles parked in the bus bay opposite. It has made some residents have to re-arrange days and times for goods to be delivered to their homes.

We have also had the experience of refuse collection being postponed, as the refuse lorry drivers have found it impossible to turn in or out of the end of the road. The residents also feel that parking in the bus bay could restrict access for emergency service vehicles if they were ever needed. We also have some residents who need services to come to their homes to pick them up and return them on a regular basis, and this has proved to be very difficult and inconvenient for both the drivers and the residents.



We would like people to recognise our problem and if parking in the bus bay please consider that it narrows the access – so we would appreciate your co-operation by parking outside the marked lines. Thank you.

### WELLDRESSERS ON LOOK OUT FOR WET BLANKETS

Every year, but in some years more than others (viz 2010), our welldressings dry out and crack after a few days. So this year we want to try something different. We are going to try to preserve them for longer by keeping the back of the boards damp, by hanging damp material against the wood which we will irrigate every night and cover in plastic sheeting to cut down evaporation into the atmosphere.

We need a number of large pieces of absorbent material – old blankets or something similar, and some very large sheets of plastic at least 8 feet long.

## LOCAL NEWS ROUND-UP

### Affordable housing go-ahead

Youlgrave Parish Council's application to build eight local needs affordable houses was unanimously approved at a meeting of the Peak District National Park's Planning Committee on Friday 15 April.

### Youlgrave bus to be cut

It has been confirmed that Youlgrave is to lose an evening bus service on the Hulleys 171 route. The 19.35 Bakewell to Youlgrave run, plus the 19.50 Youlgrave to Bakewell return, is to be axed as part of Derbyshire County Council's cost cutting measures. The service will be withdrawn in August.

### Car park damage

Police are appealing for information after the Peak District National Park's car park at Friden was vandalised. It was targeted overnight on Tuesday 15 March and again on Monday 4 April. A picnic table was damaged, litter bins overturned and tyre tracks were left on the picnic area. Similar damage has taken place at National Park car parks at Parsley Hay and Tideswell Dale. ## George Henry Birds (1923 – 2011)

George Birds died at the end of March, at the grand old age of 88. He was a well known village figure, and the following is an all too brief attempt to tell his story, and to say why he will be badly missed by his family and friends.

George lived all his life in Youlgrave. He was born in 1923 and farming was his life from an early age. He reckoned

that he was sitting astride horses as they worked the fields of White House Farm, from three or four years old. When the Second World War broke out George was only 17, and he was left to run the farm with his father Tom. He also became a member of the Home Guard. After the war, he continued to run the farm with his brother Tom. He married Brenda in 1951, and Jane,



Robert and Alan arrived soon after. The years passed until his brother retired and the decision was made to sell the farm. George then continued working with Harry Holland. He was also an active member of Youlgrave Waterworks. After he retired, George enjoyed growing vegetables, walking his dogs, and taking holidays. These included travelling to Africa, America and Canada.

Several things stand out about George. He was in many ways a larger than life character. He was over six feet tall and extremely strong, even into his

seventies and eighties. He loved showing off his strength.

Farming is a hard life and George worked extremely hard at it. Except for Sunday afternoons, he worked from dawn to late in the evening and beyond, particularly at harvest time. He never seemed to stop. He spread muck, ploughed fields, built walls, fed and milked cows, and made hay. When he had finished his own work he often worked for others, in order to earn extra money so that the family could have a better life. In winter, he was also employed by the County Council to clear the village roads of snow with his tractor. He slept where and when he could, and often boasted that he could sleep 'on a washing line'. Holidays before the farm was

sold were rare.

Having been so strong, George struggled to cope with illness and infirmity, but when he was well he had a great sense of fun and was always laughing. In recent years he particularly enjoyed telling stories of times past. While he was in hospital and feeling very ill, he still managed a smile when he told a story of his exploits in the Home Guard, and how, when he'd been on sentry duty up Moor Lane late one night, he'd gone out shooting

## REFERENDUM ON THE ALTERNATIVE VOTE SYSTEM

*The Alternative Vote Referendum will ask the public whether they favour a voting method known as Alternative Vote to replace the existing first-past-the-post system for electing MPs to Westminster. The Referendum will take place on the same day as the Parish and District Council Elections on Thursday 5 May 2011.*

A referendum asks you to vote 'Yes' or 'No' to a proposal. For this referendum, you will receive a ballot paper with the question:

"At present, the UK uses the 'first past the post' system to elect MPs to the House of Commons. Should the 'alternative vote' system be used instead?"

You would then vote by putting a cross (X) in the 'Yes' or 'No' box on your ballot paper. Put a cross in only one box or your vote will not be counted. If more people vote 'yes' than 'no' the 'alternative vote' system will be used for future elections to the House of Commons. If more people vote 'no' than 'yes' the 'first past the post' system will continue to be used.

### ***What is the current 'first past the post' system?***

The current 'first past the post' system means you vote for one candidate only using a cross (X). The votes for that candidate are then counted. The candidate with the most votes wins. A candidate doesn't need to get a minimum of votes - they only need more votes than any other candidate.

### ***What is the 'alternative vote' system?***

You would use numbers to rank the

candidates in order of your preference. You would put a 1 next to your first choice, 2 next to your second choice, 3 next to your third choice and so on.

You can choose how many candidates to rank - you don't have to rank every candidate.

To count the votes, the number 1 votes for each candidate are put into a pile and counted. If a candidate receives more than half of the number 1 votes cast then they win and there is no further counting.

If no candidate receives more than half the number 1 votes cast then there is a second round of counting.

The candidate with the fewest number 1 votes is removed from the contest. Their ballot papers are then looked at again. If the ballot paper shows a number 2 for another candidate then that ballot paper is added to their pile. If there is no number 2 vote, then that ballot paper is no longer used.

This process will be repeated until one candidate has more than half the remaining votes.

Because voters don't have to rank all of the candidates, an election can be won under the 'alternative vote' system with less than half the votes cast.

## Youlgrave Wildlife Notes: April

A very early deadline for this month, but lots has been happening!

My appeal for water voles produced sightings near the bottom of Spring Lane and between Braemar Lane and Bradford Bridge. I was looking for poo at the same spot on the 10th and also saw a vole. The first swallow was reported to me on the 8th and I've seen odd ones since. I had a report of chiffchaff early on and these are now singing all down the Dale.

There was an orange tip butterfly on the allotments on the 9th. On the 10th there was a pair of goosanders in the Dale, the female with her almost orange head and a pronounced crest contrasting with the black and white of the male.

Wood anemones are beginning to form white carpets in the Dale and there is some wood sorrel as well. The Playing Field Wildlife Area has a very good show of cowslips.

These have spread considerably since the area was re-claimed in 2003. There is a new display on the notice board down there. There are also some bluebells coming out there, but the best

show must be in the woods just before Picory Corner. One of the best local displays of wild flowers at the moment is at the top of the new village orchard where a newly cleared bank has a very colourful array of red and white deadnettles, common speedwell, chickweed and dandelions.

All nature reports are gratefully received, particularly of water voles, and I will be sending these to the Derbyshire Wildlife Trust as all information about this highly endangered species helps to conserve them.

I rather cheekily asked one of my correspondents to continue the good work on chiffchaffs with willow warbler, blackcap and garden warbler, and was asked how to recognise them. I found on-line recordings of these on [www.10x50.com/soundshtm](http://www.10x50.com/soundshtm). If this fails just try a google search. Please let me know if you hear

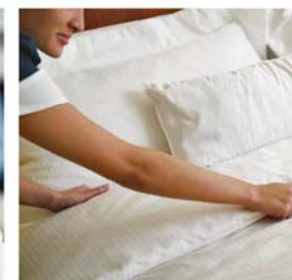
them. Dates are very useful.

## 'Ring and Ride' – a quality door to door transport service for those essential appointments



For many years, Bakewell & Eyam Community Transport has provided a service to residents of the Hope Valley and Bakewell areas, known as the Community Car Scheme. The service has been re-named **Ring and Ride**.

It is essentially the same as before, offering transport to people who may have difficulty getting to an appointment, either because they cannot drive, or they may no longer feel able to travel on public transport, for reasons of mobility; or it may simply be that the timetables are not convenient or the family cannot help out, and a taxi might not be available. The scheme has provided help to many people and our passengers have the reassurance of knowing they will be picked up from their home and taken to their destination, removing the stress of worrying about arriving on time, or knowing where to go. The driver will wait and return them home after their appointment. There is a moderate fare for the service, depending on the length of the journey.

The **Ring and Ride** scheme is made possible by a team of approximately 70

volunteer drivers using their own cars and devoting their spare time to helping others. All volunteers are CRB checked and vehicle documents and driving licences are inspected regularly.

If you think the scheme could benefit you **call us on 01629 641920**. You do not have to be elderly or unable to drive to use the service. It takes a few minutes to register over the phone, and booking a journey is a simple procedure. We only ask that you try and give us a week's notice.

The scheme is primarily used for medical and health-related appointments, but journeys such as an appointment with your solicitor, a visit to the hairdresser or hospital visiting can also be considered. Last year we undertook 3,300 journeys and one of our very grateful passengers had this to say about the scheme: "All the drivers are very helpful and easy to chat with. At the destination they are supportive as I have mobility problems. They are very patient if there is a delay. Thank you for all your hard work."
