Amy Brett: Woman of Steel

A Youlgrave woman has been honoured by both the House of Commons and the Lord Mayor of Sheffield for her part in the War effort over 60 years ago.

Mrs Amy Brett (88) of Chapel Close, a stalwart of the Monday Club, was one of the so-called 'Women of Steel' who worked in the South Yorkshire steel industry during World War II because of a shortage of men.

Amy started as a 17-year-old and for five years worked seven days a week, 11 hours on a day shift and 14 hours on a night shift. A lot of the time she worked at Tinsley Wire Industries making camouflage, welding for parts of tanks, helping in rolling mills that involved a crane and ingots of molten steel. Amy remembers how, when welding, sparks flew up into her hair and she had to keep putting them out with her hand. She still gets a sore scalp now and then.

A special civic ceremony was held for Amy and 80 of her fellow Women of Steel in Sheffield last month – although it had to be delayed for 45 minutes because Amy, her sister and town hall porter were stuck in a lift for that length of time! Incredibly, Amy met a lady who recognised her as the person who showed her how to weld, when she was 14 years old.

The women continued working through Air Raid sirens, but once the men

returned home from the front line they were immediately laid off.

Lord Mayor Councillor Graham Oxley told them: "We are extremely proud of you for the work you did in the wartime years and the effort you made towards victory in 1945. You knuckled down and got on with the jobs in those strange, dirty and difficult conditions at a time when we had our backs to the wall." All the women were presented with framed certificates of recognition and a commemorative statue is planned for Sheffield city centre.

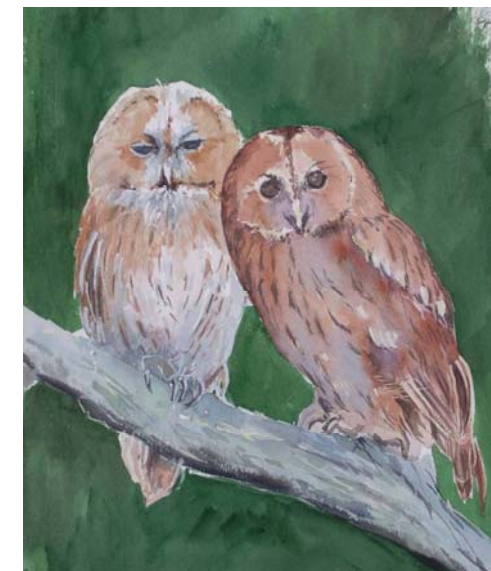
Middleton Well Dressing and Market Day: Saturday 29 May

What's in a name – Youlgrave or Youlgreave?

In 1959 the English Place Name Society (EPNS) published three volumes of 'The Place Names of Derbyshire' by Kenneth Cameron. For Youlgrave, Cameron listed the earliest written records of the name, which include Giolgrave (1086), Jholegreue (1250), Yeolegreue (1286) and Yelgreve (1318). His conclusion was that the place name meant 'Grove of Geola' (where 'Geola' was an Anglo-Saxon personal name), or 'Yellow Grove' ('geolu' or 'geolwe' having been the Anglo-Saxon for 'yellow').

Between Sheffield and Rotherham is a place called Orgreave, and in the EPNS's several volumes on 'The Place Names of the West Riding of Yorkshire' the interpretation of 'Orgreave' is given as 'Pit from which ore is dug'. In the Peak District the place name element 'greave' occurs in a few places – Congreave, near Youlgrave, Longreave Lane near Great Longstone, and Allgreave near Flash. In all these places digging, either mining or quarrying or both, has been a major occupation at least since early medieval times and in some cases going back to the Roman era. Two modern words which relate to this are 'grave' and 'groove'. The Anglo-Saxon verb, 'to dig', is 'grafan', and the noun that means 'ditch' or 'grave' is graef or 'grafa'. The latter is very close to the noun for 'grove' or 'thicket' – graf or 'graefe'. In some parts of the UK the 'greave' place name element probably does refer to 'grove' – Palgrave in Suffolk and Staplegrove in Somerset, for example. Margaret Gelling, in 'Place Names in the Landscape', says that the elements 'greave', 'grave' and 'grove'



should probably be considered to refer to groves unless there is very strong topographical evidence which points to the contrary.

In the case of Youlgreave and other nearby place names with the 'greave' element, the topographical evidence seems to point overwhelmingly to the operation of digging: lead at Youlgreave, Congreave and Longreave; coal at Allgreave; iron ore at Orgreave. As for the mysterious 'Youl' (personal name or colour), it would surely not be unusual in lead mining to dig up yellowish soil?

I would be interested to know why resident villagers have favoured the spelling 'Youlgrave' over 'Youlgreave', given the Anglo-Saxon origins of the place name and the spellings of Congreave, Allgreave, Longreave and Orgreave. The only certainties about place names are that you have to go back to the earliest sources, and even then there is always occasion for lively debate.

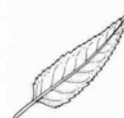
